Position Title: Generator Mechanic

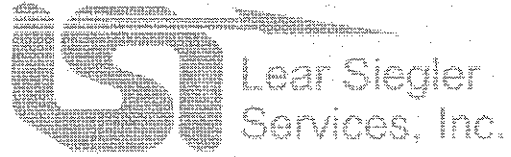
Qualifications & Competencies:

This is a position with a physical rating of heavy. Must have a minimum of three (3) years experience in power generation equipment repairs. Electrical background 1-3 years experience. Automated transfer switch and switchgear experience is a plus. Should have experience in the Army 52 Series MOS or equivalent. All branches of service are encouraged to apply. Must have thorough knowledge of Army technical publications related to power-generation equipment maintenance. Must have a U.S. passport. Must be able to pass a physical exam due to the harsh living and working conditions. Must pass a pre-employment criminal background check and drug screen. This is a one (1) year assignment. You should expect to work 12 hours days, seven days a week.

Key Responsibilities:

- MUST have a strong background with maintenance of reciprocating engines.
