Qualifications & Competencies:

This is a position with a physical rating of heavy. Must have a minimum of three (3) years experience in the Small Arms Maintenance Field. Should have experience in the 45B Series Army MOS, 2111 Marine Corp MOS or 3POX1B Air Force MOS. Must have thorough knowledge of Army technical publications. Must have a current Secret Security Clearance. Unit armorer personnel do not qualify for this position. Must have a U.S. passport. Must be able to pass a physical exam due to the harsh living and working conditions. Must also pass a pre-employment criminal background check and drug screen. This is a one (1) year assignment. You should expect to work 12 hours days, seven days a week.

- Repairs all U.S. Military small arms, machine guns, mortars, howitzers, chain guns and direct fire systems.
- Performs all levels of maintenance from 10 to the 40 level General Support.
